The Concession Seller Role at The Memorial Centre

A person selling concessions for shows and events at the Memorial Centre for Central Alberta Theatre will be in responsible for selling food and beverages before the show and during the intermission.

Reporting

Concession Sellers take direction from and report to the Front of House Manager.

Etiquette

- Treat patrons, visitors, artists, and staff with respect and courtesy
- Maintain a professional and courteous manner while serving all patrons
- Conduct yourself in a manner that portrays a positive image
- Arrive on time and stay throughout your entire shift
- Contact the Front of House Manager as soon as possible if you are unable to work your scheduled volunteer shift
- Do not report for duty under the influence of alcohol or drugs

Duties

Concession Sellers must

- Have Pro-Serve certification
- Be familiar with Memorial Centre emergency procedures. Those are contained in the volunteer handbook.

A Concession Seller shift starts one hour prior to show time.

The start time for each show will be identified on the volunteer schedule.

Concession Sellers will

- Count float and record on cash-in sheet
- Wash hands before their shift
- Check specials or any other price changes
- Open concession a half hour prior to show time
- Close concession when show begins
- Re-open concession for intermission
- Close and lock up concession after intermission
- Cash out using cash out sheet instructions in
- Clean up all empties and garbage in concession area
- Wash all counter tops and clean sink area
- Turn off concession lights at end of intermission
- Enjoy the second half of the show from your spot in the concession area
- At the end of the show take cash to safe
